KEY FEATURES OF THE VIRTUAL CAMPUS

FLIPPED LEARNING APPROACH

Our flipped learning approach transforms the traditional classroom by moving instructional content online and dedicating live sessions to active learning and collaboration.

Benefits of Flipped Learning

- Encourages students to take responsibility for their learning
- Increases student engagement through active discussions and problem-solving during live sessions
- Offers more time for personalised feedback and collaborative activities

ENGAGING LEARNING MODELS

Our teaching blends Real-Time lessons (live classes) and Self-Paced activities (self-paced learning) to create a flexible and effective learning experience.

- Real-Time Learning: Real-time Zoom classes allow students to engage in discussions and ask questions.
- Self-Paced Learning: Independent tasks and prerecorded lessons let students study at their own pace and develop self-discipline.
- Periodic on-site, face-to-face sessions: Activities and assessments, such as group discussions, experiments, examinations, or other practical activities that cannot be conducted online. The school will provide advance notice of these dates to ensure students are well-prepared.



PRACTICAL LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES AT HOME

At Al Siraat, we understand the importance of hands-on learning and encourage students to explore practical tasks even from home. Some practical subjects may include home-based projects, experiments, or physical challenges that are easy to conduct with everyday materials. Learning kits will be sent out for practicals that require specific items.

EXAMPLES OF PRACTICAL SESSIONS AT HOME:

Science: Conduct simple experiments like creating a circuit with batteries and bulbs or growing plants under different conditions to track growth.

Art & Design: Work on creative projects such as collages, digital prototypes, or sketches using materials provided in student kits.

Food Technology: Prepare healthy snacks or simple dishes under parent supervision, focusing on nutrition and hygiene.

Physical Education: Participate in fitness challenges, mindfulness activities, and skill-based exercises, with progress tracked via fitness apps.

Technology Projects: Use SketchUp or Adobe Illustrator to design 3D models and digital artwork. Students can even submit their designs for printing at the school.

Support for Practical Work: We provide clear instructions and step-by-step video demonstrations for all practical tasks. In subjects where safety is a priority, we ask parents to oversee their child's work to ensure all activities are conducted responsibly.



SUPERVISION AND PARENT EXPECTATIONS

PARENTAL SUPERVISION REQUIREMENTS

While our virtual campus promotes student independence, parental engagement remains essential to ensure students stay focused and meet their learning goals. Below are the key expectations for parents and guardians:

Below are the key supervision expectations:

- Parents must be available to monitor their child's learning during independent activities and ensure appropriate supervision during scheduled lessons.
- Parental presence is required during both Real-Time and Self-Paced learning activities as it ensures that any technical difficulties, behavioural issues, or unforeseen challenges are immediately addressed, allowing students to stay on track and maintain their focus.
- Ensure your child attends all scheduled lessons and completes tasks on time.
- Create a quiet, organised space for study, free from distractions.
- Check in with your child regularly to monitor their well-being and communicate any concerns to us promptly.
- Parents must oversee home-based practical sessions to ensure they are conducted safely.

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ATTENDANCE ATTON-SITE SESSIONS

While most learning takes place online, some activities require on-site attendance for assessments or collaborative projects.

- On-site sessions: Held once a month on Fridays from 2:00 pm to 5:00 pm.
- Mandatory attendance for practical subjects like Science and PE, as well as mid-year and end-of-year exams.
- Advance notice will be provided to ensure families have enough time to plan for these sessions.

Receive Enrolment Decision

Accept the Offer

- Upon acceptance:
 - Submit the Enrolment Agreement signed by both parents (unless court orders provide otherwise).
 - Pay the non-refundable establishment fee within two weeks of the offer.
 - A place is not confirmed until all requested documents and payments are received.
