



I look forward to meeting each and every one of you and I ask Allah (swt) to make secondary school a wonderful journey filled with lots of learning and amazing experiences.




We enact our school philosophy by living our values.

- There are five periods each day, except for Fridays which include four periods.
- Each period runs for 60 minutes, except for Quran classes which run for 30 minutes.
- It is expected that students move from one class to the next as efficiently as possible.
- Students need to be lined up outside their classrooms at the start of each period.
- Students should only be visiting their lockers before school, recess, lunch and after school.
- Students must use the playing of the nasheed, before the bell rings, as the allocated time to collect their books and make their way to their classrooms.
- Please note there is no homegroup on Fridays.
- Prayer time for Term 1 will be at 3pm due to day light saving.

GETTING READY FOR HIGH SCHOOL

WHAT TO WEAR

- Dress in your school uniform and groom yourself neatly
- Make sure you are wearing appropriate shoes for your lessons each day e.g. sports uniform if you are doing PE



WHAT TO PACK

- Pack your bag, making sure you have all materials for your class
- Bring your drink bottle, recess and lunch.
- Lunch orders should be made online. Limited lunch items are available during lunch.
- Label all your clothes and school supplies so you don't lose them.
- Read your timetable carefully and check the SEQTA Notices each day to prepare you for the day ahead.





WHAT TO LEAVE AT HOME

- · Medication that you have not registered with the Nurse's office



SEQTA is the learning portal used by teachers, parents and students at Al Siraat College. The system offers a collaborative approach to learning. You can access your timetable, coursework and assessments all through this system.



Notice boards are updated daily on SEQTA for students, parents and teachers. Using these boards gives an insight into important reminders and events taking place at Al Siraat College.

LOCKERS

Students at Al Siraat College will be provided with lockers and a combination lock, to store their books, bags and devices.

- Maintaining their locker and keeping it in good order is the student's responsibility.
- Lockers must be labelled with student name and it is their responsibility to ensure label is not removed or damaged.
- Students' class timetable must be kept inside the locker door.
- Bags must be kept in students' lockers and not taken to class.
- Students must always have a lock on their locker and ensure it is locked at all times.
- Lockers must be kept clean and tidy throughout the school year.
- Students should never tell any other student their lock combination.
- Random locker checks are conducted to ensure lockers are maintained.

Students will be allocated a locker at the beginning of the school year by their home group teachers. Students can access their locker at the start and conclusion of the school day as well as during break times.

Al Siraat College will provide a lock for students at the commencement of the school year. If a student loses or misplaces their lock, then they are required to purchase a replacement.



SCHOOL UNIFORM

Al Siraat College has a range of uniform for boys and girls that supports the Islamic Tradition. The school uniform also plays an important role in creating unity and a sense of belonging amongst students. Students are expected to comply with the uniform requirements. Non uniform items are not permitted.

Students dressed in Al Siraat College are representing the college and therefore are expected to wear the uniform in accordance with the rules and policy at all times including to and from school.

ACADEMIC EXPECTATIONS





Students are expected to achieve at least 65% across all subjects.

Students are expected to attend all their classes regularly with minimal absences.

Students are required to complete all tasks on time and to the best of your ability.

Students must maintain workbooks that are neat and presentable.

SUBJECT OVERVIEW

ENGLISH

This course aims to develop students' ability to speak, listen, read, view, and write for enjoyment, as well as with purpose and confidence in a wide range of contexts. Students are encouraged to connect their knowledge and understanding of the texts studied to their personal experience and to increase their understanding of contemporary society. The texts may include novels, short stories, film, poetry and media. Students also produce a range of texts, writing for different purposes and audiences around the specified framework of ideas.

English has 7 periods per cycle. A cycle is of two weeks



HUMANITIES

In Semester One, students will focus on 'Water in the World' and 'Place and Liveability'. They will analyse the uses of water and the ways it is perceived and valued. Students will also examine and evaluate factors that influence where people live in Australia and world-wide; and how factors can influence migration and liveability. In business and economics, students can expect to develop an understanding of consumers, producers and labourers, while exploring entrepreneurship and business planning.

Frequency/cycle:
7 hours (mainstream)
6 hours (LEAP)

In Semester Two, students will study Australia's system of government, the Constitution, principles and Australian values. The study of History will also be investigated as the topics of the ancient world of Egypt and Deep Time Australian History are uncovered.



MATHEMATICS


The Year 7 mathematics academic journey at Al Siraat College is divided into two semesters. During the first semester, the curriculum covers a broad range of fundamental mathematical concepts, including in-depth studies on whole numbers, fractions, percentages, number properties, patterns, decimals, and directed numbers. Moving into the second semester, the focus shifts to topics such as Algebra (solving both simple and fractional equations), Probability (constructing possibility spaces and problem-solving), Measurement (calculating perimeter, area, and volume of complex shapes involving triangles, circles, and quadrilaterals), and Statistics.


These topics are not only presented in a theoretical manner but are also integrated with practical, real-life applications to enhance understanding and relevance. Your dedicated teachers are committed to ensuring that your learning experience in mathematics at Al Siraat College is enjoyable and meaningful.

SCIENCE

Students will study various scientific disciplines, testing different methods of separating mixtures and learn about cycles in the Earth-sun-moon system and explain the effects of these cycles on Earth phenomena. Through this, students will develop different skills in inquiry, using scientific equipment in the laboratory and writing scientific report.

Students will learn about Biological science and Physical science. Students will develop skills on how to classify different organisms into their appropriate groups and how organisms interact in ecosystems. Through Physical science they will develop knowledge on different forces and how these forces impact their real-life situations.





ARABIC


Being an Islamic School, Al Siraat College is committed to fostering Islamic education in the lives of young Australian Muslims. Love and connection towards Islam and its teachings is a fundamental for living in a western country and staying connected with ones own muslim identity. For this, there are foundational areas in Islamic education that have been presented to students to facilitate their journey of deep understanding of how to live their live that will please their Creator and provide a benefit to the quality of their lives.

The Islamic Studies curriculum comprises of topics from areas of Aqeedah (Islamic Creed), Fiqh (Jurisprudence), Hadith (Collection of teachings of Prophet Muhammad (SAW), Tafsir (Explanation of the Qur'an), Ulum AlQur'an (Sciences of the Qur'an), Akhlaq (Morals & Conduct) and Islamic History. The curriculum builds a foundational level of Islamic knowledge, in order for students to understand the broad areas related to Islam.

Students will learn how to speak, listen, write, read and comprehend the Arabic language.

Arabic classes run 3 periods each week. Classes are theme and project based. Students are given a vocabulary list to memorise and complete spelling assessments.

Practical and engaging ICT activities are used to reinforce Arabic learning as well as termly Islamic infusion lessons which may include an Ayah, a Hadeeth or a quote.





Our Quran curriculum has 2 components, Memorisation and Reading:

1: Memorisation: Surah Al-Mulk 10 ayah per term

Term 1 - Surah Al-Mulk 1- 10

Term 2- Surah Al-Mulk 11-20


Term 3- Surah Al-Mulk 21-30

Term 4- First 10 Aya of Surah Al-Kahf

2: Reading: Students who are learning the Ma'alim-Us-Siraat Books, will continue to level 4 then move to Naathirah reading.

Students who are currently at Quran level will continue reading from the Quran (Naathirah) one to two juz per term starting from Juz 13.





HEALTH

Students will learn a range of new skills and lessons that are intended to help students navigate their lives as they enter a period of great change and growth. Students will explore topics such as nutrition, bike and scooter safety and building healthy relationships with their friends and family. We like to have fun in health! Our teachers will do their absolute best to make sure students enjoy their time in health while learning lots along the way!





P.E

Students will get to participate in a range of different activities from well-known sports like soccer and basketball, through to some fun new games that they have never even heard of! In addition to this, students will have the opportunity to try out for our interschool sport events that run throughout each term and compete against other schools. Who knows? Maybe students will even be able to bring home the championship cup for Al Siraat College!



Our Art program encourages students to engage in collaborative projects, fostering teamwork and communication skills. Students have the opportunity to exhibit their work in local art events, providing a platform for them to showcase their creativity to a wider audience.

Additionally, art history is integrated into the curriculum, allowing students to understand the cultural and historical context of various artistic movements.

FOOD **TECHNOLOGY**

In Food Technology, students participate in practical sessions where they plan and execute their recipes, encouraging experimentation and innovation in the kitchen. Field trips to local farms and food processing facilities deepen their understanding of the food supply chain. Beyond culinary skills, students explore the ethical considerations of food production, promoting a holistic understanding of the food industry.

PROGRAMMING



MATERIALS TECHNOLOGY

In Materials Technology, students delve into hands-on projects that involve designing and building functional prototypes. They explore the properties of different materials, considering factors like durability, sustainability, and costeffectiveness in their designs. Industry partnerships and guest lectures expose students to real-world applications of materials technology, providing valuable insights into contemporary manufacturing processes.



TEXTILES

STUDY TIPS

It's never too early to start some good habits when it comes to school work. It will help prepare you for success in your senior school years.

TIP #1

Summarise your notes when you get home. Reviewing your notes from school will help you to revise and keep the information fresh in your mind. These notes will also come in handy during exam time.

TIP #2

Create a study timetable. Allocating days to studying specific subjects will help keep you organised and can feel less overwhelming in the long term. A study practice like this will come in handy when you're preparing for your VCE exams.

TIP #3

Start a study group with you friends to stay on top of all homework and assessments. Working with your friends will help keep you motivated and encourage you to learn from each other and work as a team.

TIP #4

Ask for feedback from your teachers about assessment tasks or daily homework. Your teacher can clarify any confusion you may have about particular concepts and you can work it out together.



The SSD role is to work with teachers, staff, parents and students to maintain a safe and productive learning environment and school culture where students feel supported, valued and motivated to achieve their personal best.

This is achieved by:

- 1. Behaviour Education including managing more serious behaviour issues/incidents (level 2 & 3) or chronic ongoing level 1 behaviour.
- 2. Provide support, guidance and intervention for students that have been identified as those that are facing barriers to learning from behaviour, social and/or emotional issues.
- 3. Promote pastoral care and student wellbeing initiatives

BEHAVIOURAL EXPECTATIONS

OUT OF CLASS PASS

- Students who need to leave the class for a toilet break or other reasons will need to receive an out of class pass by their teacher.
- These passes can be found in each classroom.

LATENESS TO CLASS

- Students need to be waiting at their classroom door when the bell rings.
- If students are late without teacher permission given, a lunchtime detention is issue.

Consistent lateness will result in the placement of the student on an attendance tracker.

CHEWING GUM

Al Siraat is a chewing gum free zone.
 If students are found with chewing gum,
 he/she will be assigned to community
 service.

BEHAVIOURAL EXPECTATIONS

OUT OF BOUNDS

- There are certain areas in the school that Secondary students cannot socialise in.
 These areas are what we call 'out of bound' areas. Areas such as Building A, Building M Primary Playgrounds, Construction Sites.
- Boys and Girls have separate playing areas.
 E.g., Soccer field in D-block for boys,
 Grass area in front of Markas for girls.
- If students are identified in an out of bound area, he/she will be given a warning; however, continuous breaches will result in a detention or possible suspension

SKIPPING/WAGGING CLASS

 Students are expected to attend all classes including Homegroup. Should a student need to be out of class, permission must be sought from a teacher/staff member.

DETENTIONS

- Detentions are issued by the SSD staff for lateness to class and out of uniform incidents.
- Detentions are held during lunch time. If you do not attend, you will be issued an after school detention.

Further information regarding behaviour expectations and consequences can be found on the Behaviour Matrix located on SEQTA.

USE OF MOBILE PHONES

It is recommended that students keep mobile phones at home. However, in the event that they must bring them to school, the phones must remain in their locker during the day.

The use of their mobile phone on school grounds is prohibited. This includes before and after school.

- If students need to make an urgent call home, they may ask staff members in the front office to use the school telephone.
- Headphones are prohibited unless given permission in class for essential assessment purposes.
- If students need to keep their mobile phone on their person during school hours due to medical reasons, parents must contact the school and follow procedure to ensure the student device is registered.

Possession of mobile

If students are found in possession of a mobile, it will be confiscated and can be collected by parents the following day. Student will receive detention and any further breaches will result in confiscation for the term.

Use of mobile

Students will be given an internal suspension if they are found using their mobile phone. Parents can pick up the phone the following day. Any further breaches will result in confiscation for the term.



- 12:50pm 1:10pm



CUSTOMER CARE CONCERNS & COMPLIMENTS


At times parents may have compliments to express or concerns to discuss with the College. We have a Customer Care Procedure to follow if you ever have a concern regarding your child.
